Co-Curr Sample Schedule

- (Elementary) To minimize exposure and class cross contamination, campuses will implement an A/B schedule that rotates through a different fine art area every nine-week grading period. A student, for example, will take art for 9 weeks, then rotate to music, rather than alternate music and art throughout the week.
- (PreK) Pre-K campuses will schedule fine arts classes to ensure the safest environment for teachers and students.
- Due to the variety of campus sizes, schedules can be altered to fit specific campus needs.

Classroom Description/Setup:

- Adequate time between classes is necessary for cleaning (10-15 min is needed for cleaning solution to fully take effect).
- Student sit spots/chairs should be clearly marked at maximum distancing available on the floor or ceiling grid.
- When possible all art classes should be equipped with plexiglass dividers for each student, provided by the campus.
- Hand sanitizer station positioned at the door.
- Hallway markings placed outside classroom doors for distancing students waiting to enter or return back to class.
- Permanent seating charts should be used for all classes.
- No student art work will be displayed or stored.
- Students will bring Fine Arts kits every time they attend (Music and Art).



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COVID Safety Procedures:

- Fine Arts classrooms are considered common areas, therefore all students, staff, and guests must wear a mask.
- Any student or staff member that enters or exits the class during class time must use the hand sanitizer station and wear a mask.

Entering the classroom

- Hallway markings placed outside classroom doors for distancing students waiting to enter or return back to class.
- Standing at the threshold, the teacher will allow students to enter one at a time. Students will use hand sanitizer then proceed to their assigned sit spots.

Class Procedures

- The teacher should take all measures to maintain a safe social distance at all times while delivering instruction.
- Use only non-locomotor motion.
- When singing is necessary, it should be limited to 15 minutes of whole group singing per 50 minutes of class, and limited to instructors and small groups when possible.
- Instruments may be used but only under the following guidelines:
 - One to one instrument usage, no rotating instruments between multiple students.
 - All instruments must be cleaned and sanitized with proper cleaning solutions, as supplied by the Fine Arts office, before and after use.
- Students may only use his or her own Fine Arts kit.
- No hand holding or touching.
- If students leave the room during class time, they must hand wash and/or sanitize hands upon leaving and returning.

Exiting the Classroom

- The teacher will facilitate a staggered dismissal, ensuring that students exit the room at a safe social distance from their peers with maximum distancing available.
- Students will utilize hand sanitizer station upon exiting the Co-Curr Classroom.
- Students will be greeted by their homeroom teacher in the hallway outside the Co-Curr Classroom.

Extra-Curricular/After School Procedures:

- No in person extra-curricular activities for the first nine weeks. We will reevaluate at the nine week mark.
- No public performances for the first nine weeks. We will reevaluate at the nine week mark.

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5th-12th Grade Music/Choir

Classroom Description/Setup:

Entry/Exit Points:

It is recommended that rooms with multiple points of entry designate one entrance and one exit. Entry/Exit points should be labeled with social distancing markers and sanitization stations.

- All risers (standing/seated) should be removed from classrooms.
- Permanent seating charts should be used for all classes.
- Students areas (squares) should be taped out for students in classrooms to encourage maximum distancing available.
- For activities, students should be directed to maintain a safe social distance.
- All soft surface seating (couches, lounge chairs, etc) should be removed or not accessible to students.
- Only instruments that will be utilized in the classroom should be left in the classroom.
- Teachers should make sure all wooden instruments are covered at the end of the day to protect them from the electrostatic spray (5th grade).

COVID Safety Procedures:

Singing

- Singing will be limited in 5th grade music classes.
- (6th-12th grade) When singing is necessary, it should be limited to 30 minutes of class time per 50 minutes of class, and limited to instructors and small groups when possible.
- Studies have shown when singing outdoors the spread of the virus is significantly less. Whenever possible, outdoor areas can be used for choir instruction or rehearsals.
- (6th-12th grade) Students and teachers are required to wear a face-mask AND face-shield in tandem while singing. If students are unable to provide their own shield, one will be provided for them. The purchase of shields and masks developed specifically for singing are encouraged. See linka for example [MASKS](#) and [SHIELDS](#)

Show Choir

- All choreography should be produced using socially distanced guidelines.
- Students should sing outward only.
- Costume changes should be limited or avoided whenever possible.
- Microphones should not be shared or passed between students.

Procedures



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- Students will carry and manage their own binders/folders - students will not be allowed to share materials (music, pencils, paperclips, etc).

Private Lessons (6th Grade)

- Students may take private lessons on campus or remotely, but lesson teachers will provide instruction remotely.
- Private lesson teachers will not be allowed on campus at this time.

Entering the Classroom

- Students will line up outside the door standing at a safe distance, designated by hallway markings.
- Standing at the threshold, the teacher will allow students to enter one at a time. Students will sanitize and/or wash hands before proceeding to their assigned seats.
- Students will place their belongings in a safe area so that no two students' belongings make contact.

During Classtime

- The teacher should take all measures to maintain a safe social distance at all times while delivering instruction.
- Permanent seating charts should be used for all classes.
- Instruments may be used but only under the following guidelines:
 - One to one instrument usage, no rotating instruments between multiple students.
 - All instruments must be cleaned and sanitized with proper cleaning solutions, as supplied by the Fine Arts office, before and after use.

Exiting the Classroom

- If students leave the room, they must hand wash and/or sanitize hands upon leaving and returning.
- The teacher will facilitate a staggered dismissal, hand washing and/or hand sanitizing, and ensuring that students exit the room at a safe distance.
- Adequate time between classes is necessary for cleaning (10-15 min is needed for cleaning solution to fully take effect).

5th-8th Grade Art

Classroom Description/Setup:

- When possible all art classes should be equipped with plexiglass dividers for each student, provided by the campus.
- Student tables should be configured to place students at a safe social distance. For group work, the total surface of the work area should ensure that students are at maximum distancing available.
- Permanent seating charts should be used for all classes.
- Table rows should be offset and placed at a safe social distance.
- Hallway markings placed outside classroom doors for students waiting to enter or return back to class.
- All soft surface seating (couches, lounge chairs, etc.) should be removed or not accessible to students.

COVID Safety Procedures:

- Masks must be worn at all times while in the classroom.

Entering the Classroom

- Students will arrive with their set of individual art supplies.
- Students will line up outside the door standing at a safe distance, designated by hallway markings.
- Standing at the threshold, the teacher will allow students to enter one at a time. Students will sanitize and/or wash hands before proceeding to their assigned seats.
- Students will place their belongings in a safe area so that no two students' belongings make contact.

During Classtime

- The teacher should take all measures to maintain a safe social distance at all times while delivering instruction.
- Permanent seating charts should be used for all classes.
- To maximize safety, it is recommended that each student use an individual art kit containing supplies needed. Students would remain in possession of the art kit and would be responsible for maintaining the quality of day-to-day materials used.
- Campus teachers are responsible to order necessary materials and assemble kits. Each campus will be supplied bags in order to assemble the individual kits.
- No artwork will be larger than 9X12 for safe storage/portability.
- If any additional art supplies are needed beyond students' individual art kits, they will be distributed by the teacher and placed on each student's desk. Supplied items will be sanitized before and after use. Students will not share art supplies at any time.
- To the extent possible, students should not have to leave their work areas to retrieve materials and supplies from another part of the room.

- The teacher will facilitate a staggered dismissal, hand washing and/or hand sanitizing, and ensuring that students exit the room at a safe social distance.
- Adequate time between classes is necessary for cleaning (10-15 min is needed for cleaning solution to fully take effect).

- No in person extra-curricular activities for the first nine weeks. We will reevaluate at the nine week mark.

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9th-12th Grade Art

Classroom Description/Setup:

- When possible, all art classes should be equipped with plexiglass dividers for each student, provided by the campus.
- Student tables should be configured to place students at maximum distancing available. For group work, the total surface of the work area should ensure that students are apart as well.
- Permanent seating charts should be used for all classes.
- Table rows should be offset and placed at a safe social distance.
- All soft surface seating (couches, lounge chairs, etc) should be removed or not accessible to students.
- Maximize space by utilizing the outdoors.
- Open windows/interior doors as much as possible to allow air flow.
- Extra buckets and soap for cleaning of supplies.
- Safety signs: one student per sink, wait to be dismissed until called, reminders about space and operations, etc.
- Bin for used borrowed supplies

Other Considerations

- Adequate time between classes is necessary for cleaning (10-15 min is needed for cleaning solution to fully take effect).

COVID Safety Procedures:

- Masks must be worn over the nose and mouth at all times while in the classroom.

Entering the Classroom

- Teachers are to be in the classroom by the time the bell rings to allow students to enter one at a time in an effort to avoid students waiting outside the door.
- Tape marked outside the door in case waiting does occur.
- Hand washing and/or sanitizing upon entry.
- Students will proceed to their assigned seats.
- Students will place their belongings in a safe area so that no two students' belongings make contact.
- Students will sanitize their work area upon arrival.

During Classtime

- If students leave the room, they must hand wash and/or sanitize hands upon leaving and returning.
- Students will be equipped with their own art supply pack.
- Sharing of supplies should be avoided when possible.
- If supplies need to be borrowed/shared, sanitized supplies will be provided by teacher.



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Used supplies will be returned to the used supply buckets and sanitized by teacher.

- 1 student per sink at a time.
- Divider between sinks when possible.
- Soapy buckets prepared to minimize sink use.
- Students should remain at their workstations unless dismissed by the teacher.
- Art 1 and all Drawing classes utilize a sketchbook 90% of the time. This helps alleviate storage issues.
- Upper levels will utilize a portfolio and standard supply bag in addition to heavyweight mixed-media sketchbooks.
- Art will not be stored inside the classroom to the extent possible. Projects will be the responsibility of the students.

Exiting the Classroom

- Students will sanitize workspaces prior to departure.
- Dismissal by table/student to prevent gathering by door.
- Students stay seated until dismissed.

Extra-Curricular/After School Procedures:

- Medical screening for all students prior to attendance.
- Maintain the same safety protocol as the classroom.
- Recommend large space for after school rehearsal (outside, gym, church, etc.).
- Extra-Curricular activities may vary from campus to campus.
- All students, regardless of choice of instruction model, are allowed to participate in before or after school rehearsals and activities, whether these activities are in-person or virtual.
- Virtual rehearsals and activities may also be offered to both in-person and remote learners.

Performances/Exhibits

- During active community spread of disease, no performances or events may be produced for a live audience.



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5th-12th Grade Theatre

Classroom Description/Setup:

- Students' chairs/desks if used must be configured to place students at a safe social distance at maximum distancing available. For scenes and group work, students should be directed to maintain a safe social distance.
- Classrooms without tables/chairs should have taped squares for students to encourage separation.
- Hallway markings placed outside classroom doors for students waiting to enter or return back to class.
- All soft surface seating (couches, lounge chairs, etc) should be removed or not accessible to students.

COVID Safety Procedures:

- Masks must be worn at all times while in the classroom.

Entering the Classroom

- Students will line up outside the door standing at a safe distance, designated by hallway markings.
- Standing at the threshold, the teacher will allow students to enter one at a time. Students will sanitize and/or wash hands before proceeding to their assigned spaces.
- Students will place their belongings in a safe area so that no two students' belongings make contact.

During Classtime

- The teacher should take all measures to maintain a safe social distance at all times while delivering instruction.
- Permanent seating charts should be used for all classes.
- Supplies and props should not be shared. Props/manipulatives may be used but only under the following guidelines:
 - One to one usage, no rotating between multiple students.
 - All props/manipulatives must be cleaned and sanitized with proper cleaning solutions before and after use.
- If students leave the room, they must hand wash and/or sanitize hands upon leaving and returning.
- Students will use disinfectant to clean their surface/materials at the beginning and end of class. Teachers will facilitate and supervise cleaning.
- Teachers will disinfect classroom surfaces, media, tools, or equipment at the end of each class, based on usage.
- Warm ups that create a lot of sweat or droplets should not be used.
- Stage makeup will not be used in class.
- Appropriate measurements should be used to ensure students remain apart while



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blocking scenes.

Exiting the Classroom

- The teacher will facilitate a staggered dismissal, hand washing and/or hand sanitizing, and ensuring that students exit the room at a safe social distance from their peers.
- Adequate time between classes is necessary for cleaning (10-15 min is needed for cleaning solution to fully take effect).

Musical Theatre

- When singing is necessary, it should be limited to 30 minutes of whole group singing per class time per 50 minutes of class, and limited to instructors and small groups.
- Students and teachers are required to wear a face-mask AND face-shield in tandem while singing. If students are unable to provide their own shield, one will be provided for them. The purchase of shields and masks developed specifically for singing are encouraged. See link for example [MASK](#) and [SHIELDS](#)..
- Dancing must be safely distanced, in smaller groups at a time.
- Students should sing outward only.
- Rehearsals and scene work should be directed to avoid physical contact and close proximity.

Extra-Curricular/After School Procedures (5th grade):

- No in person extra-curricular activities for the first nine weeks. We will reevaluate at the nine week mark.
- No public performances/events for the first nine weeks. We will reevaluate at the nine week mark.

Extra-Curricular/After School Procedures (6th-12th grade):

- Medical screening for all students prior to attendance.
- Maintain the same safety protocol as the classroom.
- Recommend large space for after school rehearsal (outside, gym, church, etc).
- Extra-Curricular activities may vary from campus to campus.
- Virtual rehearsals and activities may also be offered to both in-person and remote learners.
- 7th - 12th grades: All students, regardless of choice of instruction model, are allowed to participate in before or after school rehearsals and activities, whether these activities are in-person or virtual.

Performances

- During active community spread of disease, no performances may be produced for a live audience.



COVID Classroom Guidelines

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6th-8th Grade Band

Classroom Description/Setup:

- The floor will be marked to designate student spots at maximum distancing available.
- Permanent seating charts should be used for all classes.
- Mark lanes of travel for students and teachers within the room.
- Entry and exit to the room will be one way only with separate entrances and exits when possible.
- A sanitation station will be placed at the entrance of the room.
- Student chairs must be positioned at a safe social distance.

Music and Supplies

- Music and instruments will be stored together. Students will get their music on the way to their seats to prevent extra movement about the room.
- Any additional supplies distributed by the teacher must be pre-packaged per student each day and placed in each student's chair. Students should not have to leave their seats to retrieve materials and supplies from another part of the room.

Passing Period (Incoming)

- Students are held in hallways with a band director, socially distanced until the classroom is sanitized.
- Students receive a pump of hand sanitizer while waiting.
- Students are sent in predetermined groups to band lockers/cubbies to retrieve instruments and supplies.
- Students are sent into the band hall at appropriate social distance.
- Students find and sanitize personal areas with a personal sanitizer kit (provided).
- Masks remain on until the teacher instructs them to adjust or remove. Masks are only removed while playing.
- Adequate time between classes is necessary for cleaning (10-15 min is needed for cleaning solution to fully take effect).

Passing Period (Outgoing)

- Students will sanitize personal areas.
- Students are sent to lockers in small groups that allow for social distancing.
- Students receive hand sanitizer as they exit the band hall after putting away instruments and supplies.



COVID Classroom Guidelines

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COVID Safety Procedures:

- First two weeks, no instrumental playing indoors.
- Under CDC guidelines, there is limited room for bands to play in the band rehearsal space for an extended period of time. Classroom instruction should occur without playing when possible.
- When playing is necessary, it should be limited to small groups and individual playing only.
- Studies have shown that nylon bell covers, flute shields, etc. reduces the spread of droplets. These may be provided by the band program, or students may wish to purchase their own bell covers and/or specialty face mask. Examples: [LINK](#)
- Studies have shown when playing an instrument outdoors the spread of the virus is significantly less. Whenever possible, outdoor areas can be used for band instruction or rehearsals.
- All playing assignments and assessments should occur via the recommended online learning platforms.
- Students entering the classroom will go directly to their spot/seat. There will be no clustering or close interaction among students or staff.
- Students and staff will wear a face mask over the nose and mouth at all times while not playing.
- Students and staff will remain socially distanced at all times.
- Students carry all supplies/equipment with them to their seat; lockers and other storage spaces will not be used.
- Students will remain in place during class. If movement around the classroom is necessary (e.g. travel to restroom, etc.), distance should be maintained at all times.
- At the conclusion of class, students will be dismissed in a staggered fashion to prevent clustering/lines on the way out.
- All common surfaces (chairs, doors, music stands, etc.) will be wiped down by a director and/or student before the next class arrives.

Private Lessons

- Students may take private lessons on campus or remotely, but lesson teachers will provide instruction remotely.
- Private lesson teachers will not be allowed on campus at this time.



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Extra-Curricular/After School Procedures:

- Medical screening for all students prior to attendance.
- Maintain the same safety protocol as the classroom.
- Recommend large space for after school rehearsal (outside, gym, church, etc).
- Extra-Curricular activities may vary from campus to campus.
- 7th/8th grades: All students, regardless of choice of instruction model, are allowed to participate in before or after school rehearsals and activities, whether these activities are in-person or virtual.

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9th-12th Grade Band (Outdoors)

Classroom Description/Setup:

- Marching Band rehearsals outside of the school day will begin after September 6, and be limited to very small (single section) groups playing instruments outdoors, stationary, at a safe distance (at least 6 ft). Rehearsals will be a maximum of 2 hours. We will use this window of limited rehearsals to evaluate the impact of in-person school on our ability to keep students safe and to ensure our policies comply with district guidelines before moving to a more expanded rehearsal format.
- Each program will create a document detailing specifics of field setup, check-in location, and traffic flow for their campus, according to the guidelines/procedures outlined below.

- The attendance and participation of bands at football games will be evaluated on a weekly basis by the band directors in conjunction with the Director of Fine Arts. Decisions made regarding game participation will be made in consideration of the most current state guidelines on social distancing at the time, and in the interest of the health and safety of the students.
- All students, regardless of choice of instruction model, are allowed to participate in before or after school rehearsals and activities, whether these activities are in-person or virtual.

9th-12th Grade Band (Indoors)

Classroom Description/Setup:

- Studies have shown when playing outdoors the spread of the virus is significantly less. Whenever possible, outdoor areas can be used for band rehearsals.
- Permanent seating charts should be used for all classes.
- Mark lanes of travel for students and teachers within the room
- Entry and exit to the room will be one way only with separate entrances and exits when possible.
- A sanitation station will be placed at the entrance of the room.

COVID Safety Procedures:

- First two weeks, no instrumental playing indoors.



COVID Classroom Guidelines

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- Under CDC guidelines, there is limited room for bands to play in the band rehearsal space for an extended period of time. Classroom instruction should occur without playing when possible.
- When playing is necessary, it should be limited to small groups and individuals playing only.
- Studies have shown that nylon bell covers, flute shields, etc. reduces the spread of droplets. Band programs may wish to purchase these using their fine arts budgeted allotments. Students may wish to purchase their own bell covers and/or specialty face mask. Examples: [LINK](#)
- Students entering the classroom will go directly to their spot/seat. There will be no clustering or close interaction among students or staff.
- Students and staff will wear a face mask over the nose and mouth at all times while not playing.
- Students and staff will remain socially distanced at all times.
- Students carry all supplies/equipment with them to their seat; lockers and other storage spaces will not be used.
- Students will remain in place during class. If movement around the classroom is necessary (e.g. travel to restroom, etc.), distance should be maintained at all times.
- At the conclusion of class, students will be dismissed in a staggered fashion to prevent clustering/lines on the way out.
- All common surfaces (chairs, doors, music stands, etc.) will be wiped down by a director before the next class arrives.
- Adequate time between classes is necessary for cleaning (10-15 min is needed for cleaning solution to fully take effect).

Rehearsals/Classes

- The floor will be marked to designate student spots at maximum distancing available.
- Permanent seating charts should be used for all classes.
- Lanes of travel will be marked for students and teachers within the room.
- Entry and exit to the room will be one way only with separate entrances and exits when possible.
- A sanitation station will be placed at the entrance of the room.

COVID Safety Procedures:

- Students entering the classroom will go directly to their spot/seat. There will be no clustering or close interaction among students or staff.
- Students and staff will wear a face mask over the nose and mouth at all times.
- Students and staff will remain socially distanced at all times.
- Students carry all supplies/equipment with them to their seat.
- Students will remain in place during class. If movement around the classroom is necessary (e.g. travel to restroom, etc.), distance should be maintained at all times.
- At the conclusion of class, students will be dismissed in a staggered fashion to prevent clustering/lines on the way out.
- All common surfaces (chairs, doors, music stands, etc.) will be wiped down by a director before the next class arrives. Limit the use of common items to only what is absolutely necessary.
- Adequate time between classes is necessary for cleaning (10-15 min is needed for cleaning solution to fully take effect).

Extra-Curricular/After School Procedures:

- Medical screening for all students prior to attendance.
- Maintain the same safety protocol as the classroom.
- Recommend large space for after school rehearsal (outside, gym, church, etc).
- Extra-Curricular activities may vary from campus to campus.
- During active community spread of disease, no performances/events may be produced for a live audience.
- 7th - 12th grades: All students, regardless of choice of instruction model, are allowed to participate in before or after school rehearsals and activities, whether these activities are in-person or virtual.
